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MEMBERSHIP DEFINITIONS

In accordance with CRSI Bylaws, Article II, Section 2: "Parents and subsidiaries or any other companies or firms affiliated through common ownership and/or interlocking directorships shall, for all purposes under these Bylaws, including membership and the payment of dues, be considered as only one person, firm, corporation, or other entity engaged in the industry."

INDUSTRY MEMBER – Includes producers of steel reinforcing bars; fabricators of steel reinforcing bars; manufacturers of reinforcing bar supports; and manufacturers of splicing materials whose home offices are located within the United States, its territories and possessions.

The term "Industry" means the business of producing and/or selling steel reinforcing material for use in concrete construction and employing a sales staff for such purpose; providing services for the preparation of placing plans and material lists; together with both the maintenance of a warehouse stock of such materials and the operation of a plant or plants equipped with adequate machinery and equipment for the production of reinforcing bars, bar supports, splice devices, dowel bars or spirals, or accessories for same.

ASSOCIATE MEMBER – Includes: epoxy coaters (non-fabricator); epoxy powder manufacturers, galvanizers; manufacturers of shop fabricating or coating equipment; suppliers of computer equipment and/or services; manufacturers of tie wire; wire fabric manufacturers; national/international labor unions or ironworker union locals; furnishers or conditioners of reusable forms; reinforcing bar placers; suppliers of estimating or detailing services; contractors; management consultants; warehousers (and distributors); and others.

FOREIGN MEMBER – Includes any person, firm, corporation whose home office is located outside the United States, its territories, and possessions and which otherwise qualifies for CRSI membership as an Industry, Associate, Institutional, or Regional Institutional Member.

AFFILIATE MEMBER - Includes regional associations representing the domestic reinforcing steel industry.

INSTITUTIONAL MEMBER – Includes any association representing domestic industries, businesses, or individuals on a national level whose purposes and goals are closely allied to or affiliated with the reinforced concrete construction industry.

REGIONAL INSTITUTIONAL MEMBER – Includes any association representing domestic industries, businesses, or individuals on a regional level whose purposes and goals are closely allied to or affiliated with the reinforced concrete construction industry.

PROFESSIONAL MEMBER – Includes persons actively engaged in the reinforced concrete construction industry as architects, building code officials, building owners/developers, civil/structural engineers, concrete industry manufacturers/suppliers/associates, publishers/editors, educators/ professors, government agency employees, railroads, and transit authorities. If an individual works for a company that qualifies for Industry or Associate Membership, that individual is not eligible for Professional Membership.

HONORARY MEMBER – Includes any person who has rendered outstanding service to CRSI as determined by the Board of Directors.

INTEREST GROUP – A group of Industry and Associate Members with a common interest. Current CRSI interest groups include the Epoxy Interest Group (EIG) and the Independent Fabricators Interest Group (IFIG).

MULTIPLE MEMBERSHIPS

CRSI members who conduct business in more than one area of the Industry and/or Associate Membership Categories shall pay dues as follows:

INDUSTRY MEMBER – Dues shall be paid on each area of activity of Industry membership in which a member conducts business (*see CRSI Dues Rate Table*).

ASSOCIATE MEMBER – Dues shall be paid on only one area of activity of Associate membership in which a member conducts business (*see CRSI Dues Rate Table*). The highest monetary amount of the applicable categories will apply.

INDUSTRY AND ASSOCIATE MEMBER – In the event a member conducts business in the Industry membership category and the Associate membership category, dues shall be paid by that member on the business(s) conducted in the Industry membership category only as described above.

<u>NOTE</u>: Participation in CRSI interest groups is voluntary and may require additional dues.

OTHER MEMBERSHIP CONSIDERATIONS

While we hope that members remain active participants within CRSI throughout their tenure, we understand there may be financial, or other, reasons for members to resign their CRSI membership from time to time.

CRSI Bylaws, Article III, Section 11 states: "Any member of the Corporation may resign at any time and such resignation shall be accepted by the Board of Directors of the Corporation in the event full payment has been made by the resigning members of all dues then owing." Such resignation must be submitted in writing to the Director of Meetings and Member Services or the President and CEO of CRSI prior to their renewed through date. Subsequent to the written notice, a conversation with the President and CEO shall be had prior to the resignation being presented to the Board of Directors for acceptance.

INDUSTRY MEMBERS DUES CRITERIA

- 1. Producer (P) dues are to be paid monthly on a tonnage category basis for all rebars shipped and billed for concrete construction application whether for own use or for sale to others. This would include both domestic and export shipments.
- 2. Fabricator (F) dues are to be paid monthly on a tonnage category basis for all rebars shipped and billed by the fabricator including mill lengths that simply pass through the fabricator directly or indirectly to the end user without shearing, bending, etc. Fabricator dues are to be paid monthly on a tonnage category basis for all rebars subcontracted to other fabricators regardless of CRSI membership. This would include both domestic and export shipments.
 - If a CRSI fabricator member fabricates rebars on a subcontract from another CRSI fabricator member, no fabricator dues need to be paid by the subcontractor as they are the responsibility of the prime fabricator.
 - If a CRSI fabricator member fabricates rebars on a subcontract from a non-CRSI fabricator member, fabricator dues are to be paid monthly on such subcontracted rebars on a tonnage category basis by the subcontractor.
- 3. Manufacturer of Bar Supports (B) dues are to be paid monthly on a dollar volume of sales category basis for each bar support product sold.
- 4. Manufacturer of Splicing Materials (SP) dues are to be paid monthly on a dollar volume of sales category basis for each splicing product sold.

ASSOCIATE MEMBERS DUES CRITERIA

- 1. Epoxy Coater [Non-Fabricator] (E) dues are to be paid semi-annually on a flat rate.
- 2. Epoxy Powder Manufacturer (EPM) dues are to be paid semi-annually on a flat rate.
- 3. Galvanizer (GA) dues are to be paid semi-annually on a flat rate.
- 4. Manufacturer of Shop [or Field] Fabricating or Coating Equipment (FE) dues are to be paid semi-annually on a flat rate.
- 5. Supplier of Computer Equipment and/or Services (CE) dues are to be paid semi-annually on a flat rate.
- 6. Manufacturer of Tie Wire (TW) dues are to be paid semi-annually on a flat rate.
- 7. Wire Fabric Manufacturer (WF) dues are to be paid semi-annually on a flat rate.
- 8. National/International Labor Union or Ironworker Union Local dues are to be paid semi-annually on a flat rate.
- Furnisher or Conditioner of Removable and Reusable Forms (RF) dues are to be paid semi-annually on a flat rate.
- 10. Reinforcing Bar Placer (BP) dues are to be paid semi-annually on a flat rate.
- 11. Supplier of Estimating or Detailing Services (ED) dues are to be paid annually on a flat rate.
- 12. Contractor (CO) dues are to be paid annually on a flat rate.
- 13. Management Consultant to the Industry (MC) dues are to be paid annually on a flat rate.
- 14. Warehouser [or Distributor] of Reinforcing Products (WH) dues are to be paid monthly on a tonnage basis on all rebars in the same manner as a fabricator but at a lower rate (see note below fabricator *Dues Rate Table* insert).
- 15. Other (O) dues are to be paid semi-annually on a flat rate.

OTHER MEMBERS DUES CRITERIA

- Foreign Members (FOR) dues are to be paid annually at a flat rate. Additional dues shall be reported and
 paid by each Foreign Member on all industry sales to purchasers and/or receiving points located within the
 United States, its territories (including commonwealths) or possessions, which sales are made by it or by any
 of its divisions, subsidiaries, corporate affiliates, or other controlled enterprises not otherwise qualified as
 separate members.
- 2. Affiliate Members (AF) dues are to be paid annually at a flat rate.
- 3. Institutional Members (I) dues are to be paid annually at a flat rate.
- 4. Regional Institutional Members (RI) dues are to be paid annually at a flat rate.

EPOXY INTEREST GROUP DUES CRITERIA

In order to belong to the Epoxy Interest Group (EIG), a company must join the Institute as an *Industry* or *Associate Member* (see dues criteria on page 3).

- 1. Epoxy Coater (E) dues are to be paid monthly on a tonnage category basis for all rebars shipped or billed by the coater including mill lengths that simply pass through the coater directly or indirectly to the end-user without shearing, bending, etc. Coater dues are to be paid monthly on a tonnage category basis for all rebars subcontracted to other coaters regardless of CRSI membership.
 - If a CRSI coater member coats rebars on a subcontract from another CRSI coater member, no coater dues need to be paid by the subcontractor as they are the responsibility of the prime coater.
 - If a CRSI coater member coats rebars on a subcontract from a non-CRSI coater member, coater dues are to be paid monthly on such subcontracted rebars on a tonnage category basis by the subcontractor.
 - If the firm also has the facilities to fabricate rebars, the firm becomes an industry fabricator member and shall pay fabricator dues established for such members as described in item No. 2.
- 2. Epoxy Powder Manufacturer (EPM) dues are to be paid monthly on a per pound category basis for all epoxy powder shipped by the manufacturer.
